LOCAL LWV of WBLAREA MAKES BIG SPLASH AT STATE CONVENTION!

The delegates to the League of Women Voters of Minnesota 2017 Convention, held April 29 at Normandale College, were very aware of the vibrant, active, wide-ranging LWV-WBLArea branch as they heard from many members during the day-long meeting.

Miriam Simmons of Stillwater made the usually mundane amending of by-laws a fun and humorous process. Liz Lauder, Shoreview, was re-elected LWVMN secretary and also shared the results and goals coming from a survey of members for a Strategic Plan for the future of LWVMN. The Strategic Plan has 7 goals, and the priorities for the next two years are to develop several new sustainable sources of income, to increase the number of members being trained to be moderators at our well-respected candidate forums, and to identify how LWV voting issues will affect various cultural, economic, and age groups across the state. Kathy Tomsich of North Oaks, LWVMN Action Chair, introduced the speaker, Mindy Greiling, former legislator and active Roseville League member.

A highlight of the day was the awarding of the prestigious Peggy Thompson Award, honoring a League member who has been instrumental in strengthening and serving her local League and community. This year's winner was **Mary Santi** of White Bear Township. Santi, a member since 1974, has led the White Bear Area LWV three times as president; helped with the beginning of recycling in White Bear, hoisting newspapers onto a truck in the WB Shopping Center; chaired multiple study committees, resulting in positions for action; marched in Manitou Days parades and collected trash during the League's Adopt a Highway responsibilities.

Candidates for public office, and their constituents, recognize **Santi** as a superior moderator during League-sponsored Candidate Forums throughout the Metro area. "Kind and inviting, quiet competence, organized, mentoring, tireless, focused, thorough, inspiring, relaxed and accepting....." These are just a few of the accolades from her fellow members in their nominating document. Santi's service to St. Mary's of the Lake church and community include organizing for Relay for Life, chaired Loaves and Fishes project, served as Eucharist Minister, usher, and videotaping services. Santi is an outstanding recipient of this award. Congratulations!
